EXPLORE EVERYTHING MUSIC HAS TO OFFER

Mount Lawley Senior High School's long running music Program has a history of enriching students' creativity, performance skills and musical knowledge.

The aim of our program is to create lifelong lovers of music, whilst simultaneously offering diverse pathways into industry. Your child's journey in our program will not only expand their musicianship, but develop transferable skills such as self-confidence, coordination, active listening, focus, creativity, empathy, teamwork, discipline, perseverance and community mindedness - all whilst having fun.

Our passionate educators cater for individual voices and ideas beyond the curriculum. We provide various enrichment opportunities including customised workshops, chamber groups, 'Music Club' and a student mentoring program.

We offer a stage for all students to showcase their acquired skills within the local community as well as at a state level.

Throughout the three year program, students participate in;

- Two classroom music lessons per week
- One instrumental lesson per week
- One ensemble rehearsal per week
 (with opportunities to join many more)
- Concert performances and assemblies

Our program offers Senior School pathways in Jazz, Western Art and Contemporary specialisations through ATAR, Certificate III and PIMS pathway (Instrumental and Ensemble Music (Practical) options.





INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

All Music students engage in weekly instrumental lessons through the Instrumental Music School Services (IMSS) program. Students are selected for instruments (with 15+ possible choices) based upon the individual student's experience and interest, as well as in association with the school band / orchestra needs and requirements.

IMSS run scholarship lesson programs to more than 450 public primary and secondary schools, reaching more than 15,000 students from Years 3 to 12. In addition to weekly small group instrumental lessons, students have opportunities to participate in enrichment music activities which combine students working collaboratively across year levels in various ensembles covering a range of styles and genres. INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC SCHOOL SERVICES (IMSS) LESSONS

The Music Program consists of three compulsory components:

- i. Enrolment in the class Music program (embedded in regular class timetable) for years 7-9.
- ii. A weekly instrumental lesson (IMSS or private)
- iii. Membership of a school ensemble

IMSS LESSON ATTENDANCE:

Students enrolled in the IMSS program are required to attend their lesson every week. These lessons will NOT appear on the students regular class timetable. Students are required to sign in and out of their lessons at the main administration office. All classroom staff are required to release students to attend these lessons. *Failure to attend an instrumental lesson is considered an unacceptable absence.*

INSTRUMENTAL TIMETABLES

Instrumental timetables are subject to alterations in the first two weeks of Term 1. Once class groups have been established, Rotating Instrumental Timetables are produced by the IMSS staff and made available to students via Connect. Additionally, timetables are displayed on the Music department Notice board and in the Upper school building next to the David Helfgott practise rooms and instrumental storeroom.

STUDENT ORGANISATION

- 1. Students must check the assessment outlines given to them by their subject classroom teachers to identify any potential clashes with their instrumental lessons
- 2. In the event of a clash, the first step is for the student to seek permission for an alternative time for their class assessment.
- 3. If this is not possible, the student must inform the instrumental teacher via email to request an alternative lesson time.
- 4. In the instance whereby a student is unable to swap a lesson time or organise around an assessment, students are still required to attend their instrumental lesson. Any missed classroom assessments will need to be completed at a different time.

IMSS ASSESSMENT

Reporting on instrumental music is completed by IMSS staff at the end of each semester and will appear along with reports from all learning areas.

COMMUNICATING WITH IMSS STAFF

Students, parents and carers are encouraged to communicate directly with IMSS staff. This is done via email. If there are any ongoing concerns, please cc the Teacher In Charge of Music in ALL emails.

PRIVATE INSTRUMENTAL LESSONS

Students who have previously received and paid for private instrumental or vocal lessons will have to continue learning on a private basis outside school. Privately taught student's membership of an ensemble may need to be periodically reviewed to ensure appropriate levels of performance are being maintained.





ENSEMBLE MUSIC

JOINING AN ENSEMBLE / ENSEMBLE ELIGIBILITY

Entry to the ensemble program differs depending on instrument, genre and students' prior experience.

Bowed Strings (violin/viola/cello/double bass):

All Year 7 string students are required to join the Junior String orchestra. This ensemble rehearses before school every Monday (7:20-8:20am).

Woodwind/Brass/Percussion: All Year 7 Woodwind, Brass and Percussion students are required to participate in Concert Band 4. This ensemble rehearses before school every Wednesday (7:20-8:20am).

Classical Guitar: All Year 7 Classical Guitar Students are required to participate in 'Junior' Classical Guitar Ensemble Tuesday 7.20am - 8.00am *See Ensemble Timetable below*

Voice: All Year 7 Voice students are required to join the school choir. This ensemble rehearses after school on a Wednesday (3:00-4:00pm). *Instrumental students are welcome to join the choir, however this may be subject to audition. In the cases whereby an instrumental student is a choir member; they are required to commit to the full academic year to all choir rehearsals and performances.

Electric guitar/Electric Bass/drumkit: All Year 7 Electric Guitar and Bass students will be invited to join one of our rock bands or jazz ensembles. Once a student is invited to attend; it is expected that this student attends all rehearsals and performances. (rehearsal times will vary)

*Students are encouraged to create their own independent groups/bands/ensembles; the Music Department will support these projects, however this is subject to rooming and space availability.

IMSS POLICY REGARDING ENSEMBLE PARTICIPATION

As part of a students enrolment in the IMSS program, students are required to participate in one ensemble. There may be occasions whereby a student may be invited to join more than one. (This can happen in the instance of singers for various bands eg. Rock Bands and Choir etc.). In this circumstance whereby a student is a member of more than one ensemble they are required to ensure that their first priority is the larger ensemble of the two. For example, if a student in concert band is invited to join a Jazz Band, they are required to continue going to Concert Band; similarly, if a voice student is asked to perform with a contemporary or Jazz band, it is a requirement that they continue with choir.

TRANSPORT & ATTENDENCE

There are multiple events that occur outside of normal school hours including weekly rehearsals, evening concerts and weekend performances. Parents and carers are encouraged to attend all performances involving their child.

Please ensure that transport is provided for evening events, as students will NOT be allowed to walk or catch public transport after the evening performances.

TICKETS

Tickets for school based events are made available approximately two weeks prior to the event. All ticket sales are managed through Trybooking. Details will be emailed to families with students involved in the performances. Tickets for festival performances are door sales only. If there are any changes families will be notified.

OUT OF HOURS RESPONSIBILITIES

All duty and care is provided for our ensemble rehearsals occurring before and after school. Parents are asked to ensure their child has access to transport close to the finishing time of all rehearsals. Students are expected to go home once the rehearsals are over.

PARTICIPATION IN MUSIC EVENTS

It is vital that ALL Music students demonstrate commitment to attend every performance of their band/ensemble or choir. Our ensemble performances are team events and attendance by all members is compulsory. This is integral to the success of the ensemble. In the instance whereby a student is sick and not able to participate in a performance; a doctor's certificate will be required.

ENRICHMENT AND EXTENSION

EXCURSIONS & MASTERCLASSES

Exposure to a range of external workshops and professional performances help enhance the knowledge and skills of our Music students. The opportunities provided differ each year to meet the needs of our students. Some of our continuing relationships include WAAPA, UWA Conservatorium of Music, Perth Festival, Returned and Services League (RSL), West Australian Youth Jazz Orchestra (WAYJO), West Australian Youth Orchestra (WAYO) and a myriad of industry professionals and music educators.

MUSIC CAMP

Music Camp is run in Term 2 of each year and is comprised of rehearsals and other musical team building activities. Music staff, IMSS staff and invited industry professionals provide focused workshops and sectional experiences within an immersive music environment in preparation for the Australian Band and Orchestra Directors Association (ABODA) and festival series. Each year we rotate different ensembles to share the fantastic experience with the focus being on Upper and Senior School students.

ART & LANGUAGES FESTIVAL

The Arts and Languages Festival Day is held at the end of March to allow all students across all areas to come together to create meaningful arts activities through the lens of their own disciplines .

For this event, the Music Department runs a festivalstyle main stage to showcase a range of solo and chamber music groups to perform contemporary and jazz styles. Similarly, we offer "Open Mic in the Trike" for students to showcase their talents, and "Junkadelic" provide a festival atmosphere encouraging student participation in their fun Musical March around the campus.

COMMITMENT

Upon being accepted into the Mount Lawley Senior High School Music program, we require students to commit to all 3 components of enrolment;

Instrumental Lessons - once a week, IMSS lessons are held on a rotational basis.

Ensemble - timetabled weekly rehearsals plus additional performances as scheduled.

Classroom Music - timetabled for two periods per week. On acceptance, students and parents/carers are required to sign an agreement form.

The Music program and IMSS scholarship is a **3 year minimum course**. Students will be given the opportunity to continue to choose from one of our elective pathways into and beyond Senior School.

Out of area students who leave the three year Music Program will be required to enrol in their local intake school.

REHEARSALS

All ensembles rehearse once a week at the same scheduled time (either before or after school). All Music students are expected to attend all rehearsals and performances on time and fully prepared. This is imperative for attaining high performance standards, consistency and the teamwork mentality we value. Please refer to the Calendar for all upcoming events on the school website. Ensemble timetables are printed on the Music department noticeboard.

PRACTICE

In addition to lessons and rehearsals, it is expected that all Music students will regularly practice their instrument in their own time. Further information on specific instrumental practice requirements can be provided by your child's instrumental tutor.

INSTRUMENTAL PURCHASE AND HIRE

We recommend contacting your child's IMSS instrumental tutor or classroom Music teacher before purchase or hire of any new instruments where possible. Information about instrumental purchase and hire can be found here http://det. wa.edu.au/imss/detcms/navigation/for-parents/

IMSS provides a hire service for certain instruments at a fee of \$120 per year. Such options can be discussed with your child's IMSS tutor upon commencement in the program.

Students are required to bring their instruments to school on days of their IMSS lesson and ensemble each week. Instruments are generally not required during Classroom Music unless notified in advance. When student instruments are not in use, they must be stored in the Instrumental Storeroom in the Upper School building which is coded and secure. Instruments should otherwise be kept at home for practicing. In the case of double-bass, percussion and piano, students can organise access to our school instruments for rehearsal and lessons at discretion of Music staff.

UNIFORM

Mount Lawley Senior High School has a specific tailored Music Uniform that students wear for ALL Music-related events.

For all Uniform shop items, please allow additional ordering time to ensure required sizes are in stock ahead of any scheduled performances;


