Next week, on Thursday, 11 April 2013, parents are invited to attend the first of two parent-teacher meetings for the year. This is scheduled for 4:00pm to 7:00pm. Information, along with interim reports has been sent home.

Bookings are made on-line through the school's website. The system is now open.

Where parents have children in both the Middle School and Senior School, care needs to be taken in making manual appointments so that travel time between the two can be built in. This is because it is not possible to house all teachers in one location and Middle School staff will be based in their communities and Senior School in the Senior School building. It is suggested that 5 minutes is used as a planning tool.

Feedback from parents is that the major frustrating point of these days is interviews running over time. Parents are asked to keep appointments to the 5 minutes allowed and if there are complex issues then two adjacent timeslots are booked or issues are followed up at a later time by a separate appointment or telephone call. Teachers have been asked to assist with time management and make arrangements to discuss issues at a later time.

If parents are unable to attend, student progress can be discussed with teachers by the telephone or email. There is an expectation that teachers will respond expeditiously to parent concerns.

The parent-teacher evening is recommended to parents as a face-to-face method of discussing student progress. It is hoped that many parents will be able to attend and make good use of the time, however, please stick to the appointment times.

Prior to the Easter break students enjoyed the annual Arts Festival where a range of hands-on activities were available. There were also a range of guest performers who provided a service to the school and entertained the students. The festival was co-ordinated by Dr Irving and supported by all staff through conducting activities or by providing general supervision. As a school with an Arts focus the Festival foregrounded the diversity of activities that make-up our creative and cultural life.

This was a school activity that was scheduled as part of the all round development of students. It was therefore disappointing to see a number leave prior to the commencement of the Arts Festival. As with sports days, the support of parents is requested in order to provide students with all opportunities to experience activities that develop well-rounded young adults.

Last week we were able to conduct a Japanese exchange program, thanks to many generous parents who offered a home stay place. As a language specialist school, and one with a multi-cultural student community, the guests were welcomed and enjoyed their stay. Thanks to Mr Jeong who co-ordinated the visit and the parents who supported the event.

The school's P&C Association is a valuable support for school programs and students. The P&C assists many areas and enhances educational projects above the levels of government funding. Some of the recent support provided includes mannequins for first aid training, additional support for literacy programs and through assisting with the installation of speakers in the gymnasium, improving assemblies, Phys Ed lessons and Healthy Active activities. The P&C is also a way where parents can find out about the school, make suggestions and influence school operations. The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, 27 May 2013. There is a new starting time — **7:00pm** after members felt that this was the most convenient time to meet. Most meetings conclude within a two hour time frame. The P&C is recommended to all parents.

A recent matter that illustrates how the P&C can influence operations lies in road safety. Following an email from a parent to the P&C and a discussion at the last meeting, the City of Stirling has been asked to assist in managing the increase in traffic along Woodsome Street. Mount Lawley PS parents have been asked to use Hamer Park as a drop-off point and not Woodsome Street. The City is also looking at restricting right turns leaving the kiss and drive on Woodsome Street (near the Middle School).

This is also a timely reminder that parents should not use the main car park as a pick-up or drop-off point for students during busy periods. Having vehicles in this area when there are many students is a danger. Road safety remains a concern and all parents are requested to assist in keeping students safe.

The school's annual ANZAC Day observance is scheduled for the last day of this term (Friday, 19 April 2013). As with all assemblies parents are welcome to attend.






